

It's been said that marriage is the union of two imperfect people agreeing not to give up on each other! So, here's a few things to keep in mind as the days turn into months and on into years:

- ◇ Take care of yourself physically, emotionally, and spiritually. Two healthy individuals stand a much better chance of being a strong, happy couple.
- ◇ Invest time in your marriage - make time spent together a priority.
- ◇ Surround yourself with friends and find reasons to laugh everyday - even when the chips are down.
- ◇ Be each other's greatest encouragement, not critic. When feeling critical, ask yourself these three questions:

1. Does it have to be said?
2. Does it have to be said now?
3. Does it have to be said by me?

(If "no" is the answer to any of these questions, pause to consider your words.)

- ◇ Be honest, say what you mean, but don't say it mean.
- ◇ Secrets are the enemy of intimacy.
- ◇ Lies erode trust.
- ◇ Be quick to ask for and give forgiveness. Life is too short to harbor resentments.

Above all, remember that marriage is a commitment to love, and feeling love is not enough. It's imperative to demonstrate love through your actions... the little things really do matter. Express your gratitude for each other every day!
